The Mercer County CVB can help strengthen local businesses because tourism counts! Each year, visitors spend \$130.7 million dollars in economic impact. Those dollars are spent in Mercer County on lodging, dining, shopping, attractions and more!

How Does The Mercer County CVB Help Draw Visitation to the Area?

When individuals are considering a meeting, event or even a day trip to Mercer County, the CVB is there to act as community concierge, working to ensure a first-rate visit. By leveraging key print and digital promotional materials, the CVB communicates the region's many assets.

How is a CVB different from a Chamber of Commerce or Economic Development Corporation?

Unlike a Chamber of Commerce or a local economic development entity, the CVB is dedicated solely to visitors to the region and the unique impact they provide to the local economy. While new business development in the community is critical, drawing in out-of-town customers is also vital.

How is the Mercer County CVB funded?

Visit Mercer County CVB is funded through occupancy taxes (taxes people pay when they stay in a Mercer County cabin or hotel room). No regular city or state tax paid by residents goes to fund the organization in any way.

What resources does the CVB provide leisure travelers?

The CVB provides key resources to visitors and residents alike. The Mercer County CVB produced a visitor guide full of information, maintains a county-wide event calendar and provides up-to-date information on social media and online at www. visitmercercounty.com.



Benefits & Services

Visit Mercer County Bags – These bags will include visitor information and selected Visit Mercer County items. To receive these bags for any special event, requests must be submitted at least one month prior to the event date.

Information Booth

During an event, an information booth can be set up with a Visit Mercer County CVB staff member to answer any questions attendees may have about the area. (Subject to staff availability.)

County Tour Guide

A tour guide can be assigned for use on any official tours planned through the Visit Mercer County CVB. The CVB is the official tour guide of Mercer County and can make itineraries for any group.

Visit Mercer County Packets

Per request, Visit Mercer County visitor packets including brochures, maps and more can be sent to attendees prior to a convention or business event.

Area Photos

The CVB can provide photos of the Mercer County area, taken by our professional photographers, to be used in event publications and promotional items. Credit must be given to the CVB.

Online Event Calendar

If an event is open to the public, it can be placed on the Mercer County CVB event calendar at no charge.

All tourism-based businesses receive a free business listing on the CVB website.
